Following the spread of COVID-19, many universities all over the world were forced to reduce or drastically restructure their educational programs.

The International Special Clinic Solutions team successfully organized the order process, delivery, installation and training of phantom heads at the German universities of Mainz, Gießen, Heidelberg, Regensburg and Frankfurt.

In May, no less than 80 phantom heads were handed over and installed at the Goethe University of Frankfurt, allowing students to continue practicing clinical treatments in a "near real patient environment". The phantom heads are mounted on a double articulating headrest which is adjustable to upper and lower jaw settings. Seminars and curricula can now continue to take place in a safe environment in the departments of prosthetics, restorative dentistry, periodontics, dental surgery and orthodontics at the University in Frankfurt, and will be used by more than 150 students.
