## The Next Generation of Braces

Next to your orthodontist, your brackets are the single most important aspect of your treatment. Many bracket systems use colored elastic ties or metal ties to hold the wire down. The *mini* uses a proprietary metal clip to hold the wire in place eliminating many of the drawbacks of elastic or metal ties.
